u6's - After a horrid couple years, the newest crop of Asquith's elite footballers took to the field with eager anticipation and exuberance. 3 returning veterans and 5 new recruits, the year 2022 was promising to be one to remember.

Tears, tackles (many made on our own teammates), back and forth tries like an enthralling masters tennis rally and endlessly tying bootlaces. But the smiles on the faces and the pride each player exhibits when they make a tackle or score a try for the first time, priceless!! With 6 of the 8 moving up to the next age group next year, this surely could be the start of an Asquith Dynasty. Another great season and can't wait for next year!

u7s - It was a tough year for our under 7s still learning the game. We picked up a couple of new players and saw the development of our 2nd year players which was pleasing to see. The boys always sang the song with gusto, whether it followed a win, loss or draw. The spirit in the side can never be questioned. Looking forward to u8s, a bigger field and a great 2023!

An early broken wrist as well as illness meant we were short some weeks and couldn't have fielded a team without the assistance of some very gifted u11s, but through all that the boys knuckled down and played some really tough footy learning that defence was more important than attack and in their first year in the Silver Combined Comp and came out on top. They convincingly won the Grand Final over Berowra with the whole team putting in a awesome effort and were rewarded for all the hard work they had put in all season. Sadly we will be losing a few more of the team this year but what a great way to send them out.



u12 Girls Tag - What a great season!!! Almost all last year's team returned, and the season was looking great from the outset. The team strung together win after win after win. Getting these girls to laugh and play footy is what I found out to be the easy part of coaching an all-girls team. Training, well sometimes a training session would break out from a tik tok dance between the girls. If anyone ever needed convincing that this sport is well and truly on the map you just had to watch the girls, parents, supporters and anyone else at the oval who watched any of the cliff hanger results this team had. As the season progressed the girls started to take training a little more serious, well a little.

The girls continued their winning ways and ended up making the Grand Final. On the field

After two seasons shortened by Covid, the Wallabies were keen to complete a full season in 2022. The interest across the community was strong. 2022 was a very successful season for North Sydney Brothers JRLFC both on and off the field.


Registrations were strong particularly in the younger age groups, with the club fielding teams in Under 6's, Under 8's Under 9's, Under 10's, Under 12's (2 teams Gold and Bronze), Under 14's, Under 16's (Combined team with Lane Cove) and Under 20's. Player numbers were higher across all these teams, making up for the loss of an A grade Men's and Open Women's team from 2021.

The growth in registrations for the Under 6's was particularly pleasing and reflects the success of the inaugural roll out of the League Ready program. Parent and player feedback on League Ready was overwhelmingly positive and will no doubt help player retention and recruitment in the Under 6's and Under 7's next year.

The success in recruitment was supported by fantastic on-field results, highlighted by the Under 10's which won the Division 1 Grand Final, the Under 9's who lost narrowly in the Division 1 Grand Final and The Under 16's Combined Team with Lane Cove who were also Under 16s Silver Grand Finalists. Across the age groups all teams performed superbly and were highly competitive.

The 2022 season will be remembered for the incessant wet weather which particularly impacted the first half of the season, with numerous training sessions and games washed out, but congratulations to the coaches who improvised to ensure the players could undertake some training, whether it be on netball courts, in gyms or on the beach and to the Junior League who rescheduled games and did everything they could to get the players on the field wherever possible.

North Sydney Brothers teams competed in the North Sydney Junior League competitions, The North Sydney / Manly Combined U12s competitions and various NSWRL Conference Competitions, along with playing pre-season trial matches against Leichhardt Juniors in March (our first pre-season trials for many years) and our Under 8's participated in the Benny Elias Shield Gala Day hosted by Holy Cross Rhinos.



Off the field, the club was able to yet again run the "Play for Free" initiative which has been integral to the rebuilding of player numbers and the rebuilding of the club in general over the last 5 years. The junior sporting landscape in the lower North Shore area is super competitive with very strong junior soccer and rugby union clubs, but "play for free" has allowed us to give kids a taste of rugby league and focus on retaining them. - Our 8s made the final for the Pepsi Cup at the Tommy **Bishop Tournament**
















